CIRCULAR TO DEPARTMENTS AND AUTHORITIES NO. 5 OF 2015

PAY RATES FOR PUBLIC SECTOR TRAINEES

This Circular replaces Circular to Departments and Authorities No. 5 of 2014 – Wage Rates for Public Sector Trainees.

The Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission (WAIRC) and Fair Work Commission recently adjusted minimum traineeship rates of pay.

This Circular provides revised trainee pay rates, based on the aforementioned decisions, for any public sector award and/or industrial agreement that makes reference to the *National Training Wage Award 2000*.

Please note changes in the format and content of this Circular, including:

- Schedule A hourly pay rates are provided to account for different hours arrangements in public sector awards and industrial agreements;
- Schedule B a revised format for Industry/Skill Level classifications is provided to reflect the 2015 State Wage Order.

The increased wage rates take effect from the commencement from 1 July 2015.

The *Vocational Education and Training Act 1996* (WA) requires that time spent in training and assessment is to be taken for <u>all</u> purposes as time spent working for the employer.

AUSTRALIAN QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK (AQF)

Junior trainees undertaking an AQF Certificate IV Traineeship shall be paid an additional **3.8 per cent** loading on the hourly rate for the applicable wage level.

FULL TIME ADULT TRAINEES (WEEKLY)

A full time adult trainee aged 21 or more years of age is entitled to **\$679.90** per week as per the *Minimum Conditions of Employment Act 1993* (WA).

INDUSTRY/SKILL LEVEL LIST

The Department of Training and Workforce Development has developed a revised format for determining traineeship Industry/Skill Levels – published by the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission in the State Wage Case General Order.

Key changes are as follows:

- The revised format no longer includes individual traineeship names.
- Each traineeship undertaken is allocated with an Industry/Skill Level based on the Training Package to which it belongs and the applicable Australian Qualification (AFQ) certificate level.
- The Industry/Skill Level is then used, in combination with the trainee's age and years out of school, to determine the appropriate minimum wage for award free trainees.
- In some cases, traineeships belonging to the same training package are classified at different Industry/Skill Levels due to differing AQF certificate levels. These traineeships are classified at either Level A or B, depending on whether the AQF certificate level is II, III or IV.

The relevant details for determining a trainee's skill level and appropriate pay rate (i.e. industry code, training package, AQF certificate level) can be found in the employee's Training Contract.
